

General guidelines for submissions:

1. There is **no** processing or publication fee applicable for this competition.
2. Each author along with their respective faculty are allowed to submit only one submission under each category.
3. Original, high quality (with at least 300 dpi resolution) images (JPEG or TIFF) are desirable for all submissions.
4. A separate title page with a clear title of 6-8 words, name(s) of contributor(s) – **not more than two**, highest academic degree and affiliation(s).
5. A corresponding author should be assigned for every submission along with address and e mail.
6. The write up should be crisp, of about 100-125 words.
7. Undertaking and copyright transfer forms should be submitted duly signed by both the contributing authors for every clinical image.
8. No references are to be included in the submissions.

Instructions for Innovative Figures:

- 1) Figures should be unique and innovative with preferably more than one technique employed for diagnosis involved.
- 2) Multiple panels may be grouped together as a Figure.
- 3) Images with only CT/MRI scans, ultrasound images, eco-cardiographs, ultra-sonography, endoscopy, *etc* will be given low preference. These may be accompanied with some other images such as:
 - Histopathology: fluorescent micrographs, unique kinds of staining, electron micrographs, confocal microscopy, *etc*.
 - Genetic characterization techniques such as Karyotyping, FISH, *etc*
 - Cases where surgical intervention is involved should be represented with before and after images of the area under focus.
 - Conditions with morphological abnormalities/ physical deformities may be depicted with relevant images of the same.
- 5) Videos associated with the cases/functional technologies may also be submitted.
 - Only one video may be submitted per submission.

- Each video should be less than 1MB in size and not more than 20-25 seconds in duration.
- Option for uploading video is available online.

Copyright transfer of the submissions:

- Besides the winning submission received under either category, the submissions considered eligible by the Expert Panel will be published in a Special Commemorative Supplement of the IJMR.
- Images/ innovations submitted for this competition **should be original** and not be previously reported/ published or reproduced from previously published material. These will be guarded by the general copyright policies of the IJMR.
- At any point, should it be determined that a given image or innovation is previously reported/published, this will lead to disqualification from this competition.
- Once submitted, the authors will be agreeing to transfer the copyright of their submission to the IJMR, until such a time that the authors are intimated regarding their non-selection, by the panel. To this effect, duly signed undertaking and copyright transfer forms in the IJMR format should be submitted at the time of submission itself. The requisite forms may be downloaded freely from www.ijmr.org.in.
- Conflict of Interest should be declared for each submission under a separate heading.

Specific Instructions for Clinical Images:

1. Only **two authors** are allowed per clinical image, at least one of the authors should be a faculty associated with the department and hospital/institute where the case was first presented and diagnosed and followed up.
2. A duly signed patient's consent form should be provided. In case the patient is deceased, the form should be signed by a family member or a close relative of the patient. The patient's consent form should be as per the IJMR format available along with this document.
3. The place (Department & Institute) and period of the study (month & year when the patient was first presented) should be incorporated within the first two lines of text.
4. The treatment strategies employed should be enumerated with outcome.

5. Follow up details of the patient should be detailed along with the duration of follow up and outcome.

Specific Instructions for Medical Innovations:

1. Only **two authors** are allowed per innovation, at least one of the authors should be a faculty associated with the department and hospital/institute where the innovation was devised.
2. The place (Department & Institute) and period (month & year) during which the innovation was devised should be incorporated in text within the first two lines.
3. Innovations submitted under this category should be accompanied with information regarding patent of the same, whether already files for patent in a separate paragraph, along with the patent number.
4. Protocol approval or ethical clearance as a part of an ongoing project for undertaking the requisite innovation should also be provided.
5. Financial support & sponsorship details should be declared under a separate heading.
